Guerin Etches Name into RC History Books

Gloria Guerin became the first-ever member of the Ranger College women's volleyball program to earn All-American status last week when the sophomore was honored by the NJCAA.

A standout from Corpus Christi, Guerin helped carry the Lady Rangers to the 20-win plateau this season and a berth in the Northern Texas Junior College Athletic Conference Tournament's semifinal. The 20-win season marked only the second time in the program's history, the Lady Rangers have reached 20 wins.

Guerin was named to the honorable mention All-American team by the NJCAA DI Volleyball Committee.

Despite missing several games with an ankle injury, Guerin was among the top players in the NTJCAC this season, earning first-team all-conference honors for her efforts. She finished her career ranked among the Lady Rangers' all-time leaders in multiple categories.

"We're so proud of her," said RC head coach Nicole Smith. "She played hard for us, and she deserves all of the honors that come her way."



Men's Basketball Team Finishes Year with Win

The Ranger College men's basketball team closed out the 2021 portion of their season on Saturday with an easy 94-47 victory over Strength 'N Motion in the Ron Butler Gymnasium.

With the win, the Rangers improved to 8-4 for the season.

Ranger College will resume play after the holiday break, hitting the floor again on Jan. 3, 2022, when they host Western Texas College in a non-conference matchup. Ranger will open NTJCAC action on Jan. 5 against Grayson College.

Women's Basketball Team Gearing Up for Pre-holiday Run

While the men's team entered the break, the women's basketball team was gearing up for a fast finish with a three-game road swing. The Lady Rangers will begin their run-on Dec. 10 when they travel to Altus, Oklahoma, to face off against Western Oklahoma State College. From there, they will finish off the 2021 portion of their schedule with back-to-back games in Hobbs, New Mexico, on Dec. 16 and Dec. 17 against NMJC and Cochise College.

The RC women will return from the holiday break on Jan. 5 when they open NTJCAC play against Grayson College.

Former Rangers Doing Well

Ranger College fans were all smiles last week when former head coach – and RC alum – Billy Gillispie almost led the Tarleton State men's basketball team to an upset of No. 1-ranked Gonzaga. Tarleton pulled to within 4 at one point before falling to Gonzaga, 64-55.

In addition to Gillispie, RC fans had plenty of reason to cheer for the Texans. Shakur Daniels and Montre Gipson – both key parts to the Rangers' national tournament-qualifying team in 2019 – played against Gonzaga. Gipson had nine points while playing 40 minutes. Daniel chipped in six points in 38 minutes of play.
