**Lady Rangers nab 4<sup>th</sup> straight win with OT thriller in Oklahoma**

Emily Vidal sank six three-pointers and Lindsey Claude chipped in 23 points on Friday and powered the Ranger College to a thrilling 97-87 overtime victory over Western Oklahoma State College in Altus in a non-conference showdown.

In all, Vidal and Claude were among five RC players to reach double figures in scoring. In addition to 26 from Vidal and 23 from Claude, the Lady Rangers also collected 14 from Wilashia Burleson and 10 apiece from Cyarah Kensmil and Jayla Hall.

Ranger is now 5-7 heading into their final two games of 2021 on December 16-17 in Hobbs, New Mexico.

The Lady Rangers got off to a quick start against Western Oklahoma, outscoring the Lady Pioneers by a 25-15 clip in the first 10 minutes of the affair. Ranger tacked on 19 more in the second and took a 44-30 lead into the half.

Western Oklahoma rallied in the second half. They posted a 50-35 run in the final 20 minutes and knotted the game at 80-80 at the end of regulation.

Ranger salted away its fourth straight victory with an 18-7 spree in the overtime frame.

Offensively, Vidal hit on six of her 11 three-point shots.

Burleson led all rebounders with nine. Chloe Malone added seven.

Ranger will play New Mexico Junior College at 7 p.m. on Dec. 16. They will close out the first half of their season on Dec. 17 with a 2 p.m. showdown with Cochise College.
