The week in Ranger athletics started off with the Ranger baseball team splitting a double-header on Sunday afternoon. The Rangers dropped the opener to Western Texas College but rallied to defeat Coastal Bend College in game two of the double-header. Alex Olivio was responsible for the first runs of the ballgame with a 2-run homerun in the first inning. The remainder of the week would be like Sunday as the Rangers complete the week 3-3 splitting series with Odessa and Midland College over the weekend.

The Lady Rangers softball team collected their first victory of the season defeating Western Texas College on Wednesday 6-3. The game was tied at three in the bottom of seventh inning when sophomore catcher, Everly Carey, hit a 3-run homerun to win the game in walk-off fashion.

Rangers Men's basketball began the week with a great road victory over Grayson College 111-105. The high scoring Rangers were led by freshman Jared Clawson who scored 30 points off the bench going 8-for-12 from the three-point line.

Unfortunately, the men's basketball hot streak came to an end on Saturday as the Rangers dropped a conference road game to Southwest Christian.

Finally in sports, coach Gabi Laurant's Ranger Women's Basketball team picked up two big victories over the past week. On Wednesday, the Lady Rangers knocked off Cisco College 66-45. Saturday, the Lady Rangers defeated Southwest Christian in a tough road environment 62-38. Sophomore Wilashia Burlison led the Lady Rangers in scoring in both matchups.

Men's and women's basketball will host their final two home games of the season this week at Ron Butler Gymnasium against Weatherford College on Monday and Hill College on Wednesday. The Lady Rangers begin both double-headers at 5pm followed by the men's team at 7pm.
