VI.-Core Objectives

This course meets the following of the six Core Objectives established by Texas:

- **Critical Thinking Skills (CT)**—Creative thinking, innovation, inquiry, and analysis; evaluation and synthesis of information
- **Communication Skills (COM)**—effective development, interpretation and expression of ideas through written, oral, and visual communication
- **Empirical and Quantitative Skills (EQS)**—The manipulation and analysis of numerical data or observable facts resulting in informed conclusions
- **Teamwork (TW)**—The ability to consider different points of view and to work effectively with others to support a shared purpose or goal
- **Social Responsibility (SR)**—Intercultural competence, knowledge of civic responsibility, and the ability to engage effectively in regional, national, and global communities
- **Personal Responsibility (PR)**—The ability to connect choices, actions, and consequences to ethical decision-making

Did you know the library can help you with these Core Objectives? Our big three are critical thinking, communication skills, and empirical and quantitative skills. We can provide library instruction that develops all of these in your students, but just being involved in teaching like ours strengthens their ability to work together and be responsible members of the community. The more skilled at learning they become, the easier it is for them to engage in decision making that is beneficial for their long-term goals. We can work with you in the library or the classroom!
